

**EASTAMPTON TOWNSHIP COUNCIL**  
**REGULAR SESSION MINUTES**  
**February 14, 2011**  
**7:30 p.m.**

Mayor Campbell called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

Everyone participated in the flag salute.

Mayor Campbell certified that notice of this meeting was published in the Burlington County Times on January 7, 2011. Notice was posted on the Municipal Bulletin Board and sent to the Courier Post for information. All requirements of the "Open Public Meetings Act" were satisfied.

Present were: Mayor Louise Campbell, Deputy Mayor Keith Nagler, Council Member Rovenna Overton, Council Member Jay Springer and Council Member Ricardo Rodriguez. Also present were: Township Attorney Eileen Fahey, Municipal Clerk Kim-Marie White and Township Manager Scott Carew.

**TOWNSHIP MANAGER'S REPORT:**

- Township Engineer – Eastampton Road Improvements

Township Engineer Jamanow discussed with the Township Council road improvement projects and the grant awarded to the township for Monmouth Road sidewalks.

Township Manager Carew said he would like Council to approve a special emergency note in the amount of \$50,000 to cover unrelated costs for the codification.

Township Manager Carew said he has been having discussions with staff to see if they should bring trash pickup in house, or try a shared service with another township. He wants to find the most cost effective way to make it happen and still have the level of service for the residents.

Ordinance 2011-1                      An Ordinance To Amend Chapter 96 of the Eastampton Township Code at Article VIII With Respect to Snow Emergency and Other Emergency Parking Regulations

Mayor Campbell opened the public hearing.

John Geary, 6 Knotty Oak Drive asked if the ordinance includes the trailers that are parked on the street.

Mayor Campbell said it would include trailers.

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Ken Beam, 23 Woodhurst Drive, asked how the residents are notified of an emergency snow storm.

Township Manager Carew said that notice is on the sign, website and facebook.

There being no further comments she closed the public hearing.

Mayor Campbell said there was a motion about two years ago stating that the only way Eastampton would consider a merger of police services was if Eastampton were the lead agency.

It was MOVED by NAGLER and seconded by SPRINGER to have Mayor Campbell respond to Mayor Camp's letter on behalf of the Township Council.
