

SNOW REMOVAL INFORMATION

The Public Works Department is responsible for clearing snow from Township roadways. Crews push snow back to the curb whenever possible.

There are several miles of roadway within the Township that needs to be cleared. Please be patient during this time as it may take some time to get to your specific street.

Township Ordinance requires residents to remove their vehicles from the street during a snowfall to allow our crews to push the snow back as far as they can.

Homeowners are reminded that Township Ordinance also prohibits placing snow in the streets.

Snowplows will deposit snow at the base of your driveway or onto your sidewalks.

All emergency information regarding snow removal and possible service interruption of trash collection or recycling will be posted on the website.

Week of 11/24, Thanksgiving Holiday. Trash will be collected one day earlier than usual. Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday

**Week of 12/22, Christmas Holiday. Trash will be collected as follows:
Tuesday route on Monday,
Wednesday route on Tuesday,
Thursday route on Friday.**

Week of 12/29, New Years Holiday. Trash will be collected Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday (same as Christmas week).

TRASH COLLECTION

Trash is collected once per week. The day of collection varies by street and neighborhood. Collection days are as follows:

- **Tuesday – Vista and Lakeview developments**
- **Wednesday – Creek areas, Trailer Park, and all other streets**
- **Thursday– Eastampton Farms and Carriage Park developments**

Trash should be placed in durable receptacles or secured in bags. Cans or bags should be no larger than (64) sixty-four gallon size. Bags and cans should not weigh more than (50) fifty pounds.

Trash containing recyclables **will not** be collected.

Trash may be placed curbside no earlier than 6:00 pm the day before scheduled collection.

Cans and receptacles should be removed from the street by 9:00 pm the day of collection.

Televisions, computer monitors, and computer equipment are considered electronic waste and must be disposed of accordingly.

Fluorescent light bulbs are considered hazardous waste and must be disposed of accordingly. Please visit our website for up-to-date disposal information for these and other hazardous waste.

White goods are collected the first Thursday of each month. Residents should call the Township at 609-267-5723, ext. 200 to be placed on the collection list.

BRUSH COLLECTION

The Township provides for disposal of tree branches and limbs through our Brush Collection Program.

Brush should be placed curbside for collection the first full week of each month. Branches and limbs must be less than (8) eight inches in diameter. Branches and limbs must be (4) four feet long or longer. All butt ends must face the same direction. Branches and sticks smaller than (4) four feet in length can be bundled or bagged and disposed of with regular trash. Tree parts and stumps larger than (8) eight inches in diameter are not collected. All vines, bamboo, and debris must be removed from all brush. Excessive amounts of brush **will not** be collected.

The Public Works Department collects Christmas Trees during the month of January and February. All ornaments, lights, and decorations must be removed. Trees coated with artificial snow should be placed curbside for collection with regular trash.

RECYCLING

Cardboard, paper, plastic, aluminum and glass containers are considered recyclable. Recycling is collected by the County every other Monday, except for holidays.

LEAF COLLECTION

The Public Works Department collects leaves starting in mid-October and ending on May 1st.

Leaves can be raked to the curb or placed in bags for collection. Leaves should not contain sticks, trash, or debris.

During October, November, and December, the crews follow a schedule and collect each area once per week. The Township is broken into (3) three areas.

The crew spends one week in the area before moving on to the next area. Due to the volume of leaves curbside, the crew may not make one complete pass through the area. However, when crews complete the area early, they may move into the next area to stay ahead of schedule.

After January 1st, crews collect when needed, at least once per week. Residents completing Spring cleanups can place leaves curbside for collection.

Due to workload and priorities, no leaves are collected after May 1st.

Once leaf collection operations have begun, bagged grass will be collected with the leaf vac while they are collecting leaves.

****GRASS CLIPPING DISPOSAL****

The Township will continue to collect bagged grass clippings through the Spring and Summer. Cans or bags should weigh less than fifty (50) pounds. Residents are encouraged to consider mulching or recycling their grass. When you bag and throw away your grass clippings, it increases the weight of the solid waste that we bring to the landfill, which increases our disposal fees.
